
Drug Status Report

Drug: Racemic cis-Despropionyl mefentanyl N-trichloroacetate

Drug Name Status: Rac cis-Despropionyl mefentanyl N-trichloroacetate is the common name.

Chemical Name: 3-Methyl-N-phenyl-1-(2-phenylethyl)-4-piperidinamine, N-trichloroacetate

Molecular Formula: C₂₂H₂₇Cl₃N₂O₂

Pharmacological class / Application: Fentanyl

CAS-RN: 144480-17-1

International status:

US: Racemic cis-Despropionyl mefentanyl N-trichloroacetate is not listed specifically in the Schedules to the US *Controlled Substances Act* and is not mentioned anywhere on the DEA website. However, it may be considered controlled due to the analogue provision of the US CSA.

United Nations: The substance is not listed specifically on the Yellow List - List of Narcotic Drugs under International Control nor the Green List - List of Psychotropic Substances under International Control.

Canadian Status: Racemic cis-Despropionyl mefentanyl N-trichloroacetate is not listed specifically in the CDSA. However, the substance contains the core structure of the fentanyls and therefore must be included under the heading "Fentanyls, their salts, derivatives and analogues and salts of derivatives and analogues, including" of item 16 of Schedule I to the CDSA.

Recommendation: Racemic cis-Despropionyl mefentanyl N-trichloroacetate is included under item 16 of Schedule I to the CDSA and is a controlled substance.
